ADHD Assessment Child & Adolescent

A diagnostic assessment for ADHD looks closely at your child's attention, activity levels, impulsivity and executive functioning, and how these affect them at home and at school. It gives you a clear, evidence-based understanding of your child's needs and, where the criteria are met, a formal diagnosis to guide support.

WHO IT IS FOR

This assessment suits children and adolescents where there are concerns about attention, restlessness, impulsivity or behaviour, and a diagnosis has not yet been established. It provides clarity about whether these are consistent with ADHD.

TAILORED TO YOUR CHILD

Every assessment is tailored to your child, their age, and the concerns raised at referral. The clinical psychologist gathers information from parents and teachers and selects the measures most relevant to your child.

WHAT WE ASSESS

The assessment is guided by DSM-5-TR criteria for ADHD and considers:

- Inattention
- Hyperactivity and impulsivity
- Executive functioning
- Emotional and behavioural regulation
- Impact at home and school
- Co-occurring difficulties

Assessment Measures

The battery is tailored to each child and confirmed at the clinical interview. Depending on presentation and referral question, it may draw on the following.

Conners Comprehensive Behaviour Rating Scale (Conners CBRS)

A broad, multi-informant rating scale completed by parents and teachers, and the young person where appropriate, giving a complete overview of behavioural, emotional and social concerns for ages 6 to 18.

Conners Early Childhood (Conners EC)

An early childhood rating scale for ages 2 to 6, completed by parents and teachers, supporting early identification of behavioural, social, emotional and developmental concerns.

Conners 4

A rating scale completed by parents, teachers and, where appropriate, the young person, focused on ADHD and its common co-occurring difficulties in children and adolescents aged 6 to 18.

Comprehensive Executive Function Inventory (CEFI)

A parent and teacher rating scale measuring everyday executive functioning across attention, emotion regulation, flexibility, inhibitory control, organisation, planning, self-monitoring and working memory.

MOXO Continuous Performance Test

A computer-based test that provides objective measurement of the four core areas of ADHD: attention, timing, impulsivity and hyperactivity.

Adaptive Behaviour Assessment System, 3rd Edition (ABAS-3)

A standardised rating scale that assesses the practical skills needed for daily living across conceptual, social and practical domains.

THE REPORT

A comprehensive report outlining the assessment findings, the diagnostic outcome, and practical recommendations to support your child at home, at school and in the community.

FEEDBACK SESSION

A dedicated feedback session with the clinical psychologist to walk through the findings, answer your questions, and discuss recommendations in detail.
